


Nastasia was an IGAP Coordinator for 3 years before she became the Environmental Planner at AVCP.

Partnerships: Paatnarput:

We are a consortia and serve the 56 tribes in the AVCP Region. We couldn't do that effectively without teamwork. Over the years we have worked with RAVN and NAC to help get and ship recyclables from villages to Bethel, to Anchorage and further. We have also been working with Delta Backhaul Company this year on some innovative projects.







Delta Backhaul Company

What we have done in the past

- Technical Assistance over the phone/email/in person
- Find/email templates
- Guidance on filling out forms-to the best of our knowledge
- Pick up e-waste and store them to be shippeddepending on funding/room for storing
- Pick up/transport ALPAR bags to NAC
- Find training sessions
- Talking to project officers
- Helping/guiding with closeouts/proposals/qr's
- We try our best to help in anyway we can, and if we don't have the answers, we try our best to find them, or someone who can answer them.



With RAVN: RAVN-akun:

RAVN allows tribal IGAP workers to ship out e-waste/lightbulbs for free from village to Bethel, if there's room on the flight. Then we pick it up from cargo. But the items being shipped have to be packaged and labeled properly. Safety is always the first priority and should be yours. We prefer if you call us before shipping anything, just so we can make a plan. Also RAVN prefers if they are shipped during the weekday, just so they don't have stuff sitting up there for days.



Through NAC:

Some tribes bring ALPAR bags by boat and we pick them up and bring them to NAC to be shipped through the flying cans program. The bags should not be torn and should be labeled. Ryan Air also takes bags for free from villages-depending on cargo room, to be shipped to anchorage under the flying cans program.








From Tribes

- For a few years AVCP
 Environmental Staff has picked up and stored some items from villages to be shipped for recycling.
- E-waste-tv's, monitors, printers, anything with a plug, or battery
- Fluorescent light bulbs/tubes
- Household batteries







Materials are stored

We store them in our Connex or the AVCP fish plant if there's space.

Backhaul to the future E-Waste Drive 2019

This year we held an E-waste drive for Bethel residents only. This effort was done in partnership with Delta Backhaul Company. We collected material that can be considered hazardous for free from residents.

Materials we collected

- Used oil/waste oil
- Solvents (brake cleaner, acetone, degreasers, nail polish remover)
- Antifreeze
- House-hold hazardous chemical (ammonia, drain cleaner, insect repellent, pesticides)
- Lead-acid batteries
- Electronic waste (televisions, computers, i-pads, phones, anything with a batt. or cord)
- Fluorescent tubes
- Oil based paints
- Household batteries

Wrap Up



Goal -

- Develop Backhaul infrastructure for region
- Establish annual program to remove wastes as it accumulates.
- Smaller loads shipped out on planes, ice roads, barge
- Project planned for the next 10+ years

Project currently on hold due to opposition of development on the Kuskokwim.
